ECUADOR: U.P.U. COATS 1896, THE LAST "SEEBECK" ISSUE

The purpose of this one-frame exhibit is to show, in a traditional way, the 1896 "Seebeck issue" of stamps and postal cards.

Background: Ecuador cancelled the contract with the Hamilton Bank Note Company on November 8th, 1895. At that time, the postal issue for 1896, was already requested. As Ecuador had not contacted any other printing source, and Hamilton had already started the production, Ecuador accepted to pay for the stamps provided.

The Ecuadorian Government never returned the remains of this issue. There are reprints of these series, which evidences that Hamilton Bank Note Company, continued to use the printing plates.

The philatelic press of the time, reports as date of emission, April 15th, 1896, but, the earliest known letter is dated in Guayaquil, March 11th of 1896.

Scope: The content of this exhibit is exceptional as it shows: Composite Die Proofs, Color Proofs, Specimens and Varieties of the last Seebeck Issue.

The exhibit includes mint series, the biggest known blocks and at least one representative used item for postal purpose in each value. Special care has been taken in choosing the pieces that are in accordance with the appropriate rate and that include early or late dates, as well as special destinations.

Two surcharges that were ordered due to the lack of 5 and 10 centavos stamps are part of this exhibit. So the 20 centavos were required to be surcharged with "CINCO CENTAVOS" in black, two rows, and the 50 centavos stamp with "DIEZ CENTAVOS" in red, two rows.

All known tilt angle varieties are presented in these surcharges.
Also included are the "Chimboracitos" revalidations "1897-1898" in small fonts, which for emerging reasons, were hand stamped on the values of 2 and 20 cents.

The last two postal stationery cards that Hamilton Bank Note Company produced for Ecuador are parte of this exhibit. They are the 2 and 3 centavos cards whose indicia are identical to the values of the regular series.

Importance: This is the first occasion that the last Seebeck issue has been exhibited. Literature written about this subject is scarce. My personal research documented in this exhibit corrects many inaccura-

The rarity factor of the last Seebeck issue is based on my personal research and on auctions results and material encountered in other collections. The items that are possibly unique, which less than five of them have been recorded, are framed in red.


